**Course Description:** This course introduces the nature of human language to students, with respect to phonetics (the sounds of language), phonology (the sound patterns of language), morphology (the structure and properties of words), semantics (the meaning of language) and syntax (the sentence patterns of language). It also provides a view of the biological characteristics of language, in terms of how it is acquired and processed by the human brain. Furthermore, it also discussed the social aspects of language.
