Course description: This course provides students with an introduction to the field of environmental history focusing on the past one hundred years of environmental change around the globe. The course will explore different themes in environmental history, including the environmental impact of humans, the history of sustainable development, environmental justice movements and national programs of nature conservation. Students are expected to read approximately 40-50 pages of text materials each week that will be made available online and to watch five feature-length films.

Learning Outcomes: Students will evaluate eight central topics in environmental history: conservation, sustainable development, ecology, environmental justice, pollution, climate change, natural disasters and environmental politics. They will analyze and critique intellectual arguments using primary and secondary sources, and they will present clear and well-argued reasoning to defend or refute historical arguments about topics in environmental history both in writing and in oral presentation

Assessments:

- Quizzes: there will be three untimed take-home quizzes during the term (10% each)
- Homework: students will have two group homework assignments (20%)
 These are mini-presentations students will present during class. (20%)
- Participation: students are expected to periodically answer a question of the day (10%)
- Book Review: students will read and review a book in environmental history (20%)
- Timeline Project: students will work alone or with one other student to complete a final timeline project. This exercise will replace a final exam (20%)
