Appendix I Courses taught at HKUST

I. Common Core Courses

HUMA 1650 Appreciation of Western Art

The course is an introduction to the appreciation of art through selected works of painting and sculpture from the West, from ancient periods to the present. Students will learn to use different approaches to understand the language of art and the complexity of artistic creation in Western culture.

HUMA 2661 Chinese Oil Painting

This course gives students knowledge of the development of oil painting in China. Focusing on the history of China in the 20th and 21st centuries, the course explores the social, cultural and political circumstances that favored, oppressed and directed the path of the development of Chinese oil painting in different periods.

HUMA 2670 Understanding Western Painting

This course introduces students to the masterpieces of Western painting through an outline of chronology, painting techniques, painting genres by themes and the lives of the most renowned Western painters from ancient Greece to the mid-20th century.

HUMA 2680 Understanding Western Architecture

This course gives students fundamental knowledge of the masterpieces of Western architecture and the variation in styles in different epochs and cultures, from ancient Greece to the 21st century.

HUMA 3680 Contemporary Architecture: The Pritzker Prize Winners

The course introduces students to contemporary architecture through the study of the works of the winners of the yearly Pritzker Architecture Prize. It will cover the monographic studies of its winners from its establishment in 1979 to the present. Architectural styles and works of the awardees and the most recent trends in architectural design and technology will be covered as well.

II. Non-Common Core Courses

HUMA 4650 Western Painting: From Renaissance to Impressionism

The course is an in-depth study of the styles and characteristics of Western painting from 1400 to 1900. Students will be introduced to the methodologies of the subject, i.e. socio-historical, iconographical, thematic, technical and material analyses of the masterpieces from different countries and epochs, and will have the chance to apply their knowledge to a small-scale research project of a relevant topic.
