Enjoyment of Classical Music

INSTRUCTOR: Professor Isaac Droscha

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COURSE OBJECTIVES:

In this course students will learn to love everything that is special about classical music, from the full impressive power of a concert orchestra to the intimate and mysterious solo piano. This course is designed to introduce students to the wide variety of styles and sounds of Western classical music. The listening and analytical skills demonstrated will bring about a deeper understanding of music as an art form. Prior musical training is NOT required.

INTENDED LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Students will:

- 1. Through a historical survey, develop a deeper appreciation of classical music
- 2. Through an analysis of artistic trends, describe the cultural and historical development of classical music
- 3. Through analysis of specific works, understand music theory fundamentals
- 4. Through the concert report requirement, critique live music performances
- 5. Apply analytical skills from this course to other disciplines
