Final Project Presentation 40%

Task:

Create a piece of video art with a specific idea and applied skills (Written Statements are needed)
It is a group project of 4 to 5 students. (3 mins video)

Narrative approach is necessary, storyboard
(Good works will be recommend to join video competition)

- . Written Statements (Explain your project within 500 words with clear concepts)
- . A3 size storyboard
